Tonight we are honored to host the debut of Eric's new CD, Hollywood Pocketknife. Early reviews for this new CD gush with admiration for this master songsmith's novelistic songs and compelling guitar arrangements.



Integral to Houston's early 70's folk music scene, Eric works influenced those of Townes, Nanci, Lyle and Guy. His intense, image-filled songs sketch characters and their stories, their joys, regrets, hopes and despair all in sparse, concise and direct lyrics. A mesmerizing performer, Eric tends to a bluesy musical landscape, but humor and truth also shine through his impressionist works. Nanci claims Eric to be the William Faulkner of songwriters. We certainly do agree.

Calvert and Connie Mims. Briefly renamed St Elmo's Fire, Wheatfield gained national attention as one of PBS's first Austin City Limits TV show. Their bouncy and driving modern folk music influences Trout's songs, and vice-versa with touches of pop, rock, bluegrass and jazz. With seven #1 songs — some Grammy-nominated — Steve is respected as contemporary songwriter. While others such as Peter Paul & Mary, Tim McGraw, Colin Raye and Michael Montgomery have popularized Steve's works, a rare



performance by the author is eminently more precious: Hearing the intended passions, humor and inflections make them a shared personal experience.
